WHAT DOES PIONEER BANK, F.S.B. DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Social Security number and credit history ● Account transactions and checking account information ● Account balances and payment history <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Pioneer Bank, F.S.B. chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Why can't I limit all sharing?	Federal law gives you the right to limit only <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes - information about your creditworthiness ● affiliates from using your information to market to you ● sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.
Definitions	
Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>Our affiliates include:</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>Companies with a Pioneer Bank, F.S.B.; Pioneer Mortgage Company, Inc. and Liberty Home Financial</i>
Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and non-financial companies. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>Pioneer Bank, F.S.B. does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.</i>
Joint Marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● <i>Pioneer Bank, F.S.B. doesn't jointly market.</i>

Your Privacy is a Priority To Us

At Pioneer Bank, we are committed to safeguarding customer information. Since your privacy is a priority to us, Pioneer will not share nonpublic information about you with third parties, except as explained in our Privacy Policy. We have created our Privacy Policy to communicate our privacy commitment to you, and to serve your privacy needs.

Privacy Policy

We are required to or we may provide information about you to third parties outside Pioneer Bank without your consent, as permitted by law, such as,

To respond to a subpoena or court order, judicial process or regulatory authorities;

To consumer reporting agencies;

In connection with a proposed or actual sale, merger or transfer of all or a portion of our business;

To protect against fraud

Our Security Practices and Information Accuracy

Internally we take steps to safeguard customer information. We restrict access to the personal and account information of our customers to those employees who need to know that information in the course of their job responsibilities. We maintain physical, electronic and procedural safeguards that comply with federal standards to protect customer information. Pioneer also has internal controls to keep customer information as accurate and complete as we can. Information we get from you when visiting our website.

We use cookies and similar technologies to identify your browser or device. Cookies are text files containing small amounts of information which are downloaded to your device when you visit a website. Cookies do not contain any data that enables us to determine your actual identity, and they are useful because they allow a website to recognize a user's device.
